

1926 – “THE HOLLOCAUST” of the Americas

- ▶ **1926** – Arthur C. Parker wrote “An Analytical History of the Seneca Indians” for the New York State Archeological Association, Rochester, NY.
 - ▶ Parker used “The Hollocaust” to refer to the total destruction of Haudenosaunee towns, food supplies, orchards, crops (p. 126) and the loss of Indigenous homelands to White settlers.
 - ▶ The Indigenous peoples “HOLLOCAUST” of the Americas was the term used **20 years before** it was used to refer to the Jewish Holocaust of World War II.
- ▶ **One Example among many:**
- ▶ **May 28, 1830** – US President Andrew Jackson signed the **Indian Removal Act** that resulted in the genocide of thousands of Indigenous peoples including one-quarter (1/4) Cherokee Nation (“Trail of Tears) and the forced removal of over 50,000 Indigenous Peoples from their traditional homelands that was immediately settled by Europeans. He is known as the “Indian Killer” President.

Jackson’s picture currently hangs near President Trump’s desk - in 2019.
